Legislative Educational Event Planning

We can educate and present the facts of each topic.</p> <p>Maggie – the event can be held here at Southeastern Idaho Public Health again. We are planning for October 24<sup>th</sup> at 6:00pm. Laurie will arrange the catering and the invitations.</p> <p>Fran – will we be able to let them know what topics will be discussed before?</p> <p>Dave – We could talk about what is coming as far the Youth Empowerment Services and what the future of children’s mental health. Dave and Brad will make a 10-15 minute presentation.</p> <p>Bob – for Recovery Support Services, the main focus should be on the crisis/transitional center proposal that region 6 is working on. We need to educate the candidates on what it can provide and how it can benefit behavioral health in the region.</p> <p>Maggie – we could possibly have a family or person share their story and how they have been impacted. Possibly from opioid use or suicide. This would be a good tie in to the crisis center conversation and how it will be helping actual people in our community.</p> <p>Lynda – there are 2-3 families that have been turned away from the crisis center in Idaho Falls because of lack of beds.</p> <p>Hailey – there is a man named Logan Zuck who lives in Idaho Falls that often speaks about his mental health struggles and the support he has received from the crisis center. He could be contacted to speak.</p> <p>Mark – we could have him speak and then have a presentation about the crisis/transitional center proposal.</p> <p>Maggie – we would need to provide an honorarium for speakers.</p> <p>Lynda will contact the family that she knows that was turned away from the crisis center.</p> <p>Hailey will contact Logan Zuck.</p> <p>Barry – Moved to approve a \$100.00 honorarium for both speakers</p> <p>Bill – seconded the motion. Motion passes unanimously.</p> <p>Charlie will be presenting the crisis/transitional center proposal.</p> <p>We will try to get an estimate of how many people will be attending, and then we can plan a budget for the food provided. We do need to follow state purchasing rules for food.</p>

<b>Naloxone Distribution</b>		
Discussion	<p>Maggie – There was a state grant that funded the purchase of Naloxone doses. Southeastern Idaho Public Health has received some doses and would like to distribute them to community partners who may encounter someone in an overdose situation.</p> <p>Paul – The police department was working on trying to get one to each officer so that they each have one on duty.</p> <p>Chris – Hope and Recovery has been selling the doses at cost to people who need them. Around \$75.00.</p> <p>JoAnn – Is in contact with all the sheriff’s departments in region 6. She would be willing to contact each department to see if there is a need for them.</p> <p>Fran – This is the antidote for an overdose on opioids? Will a person go into withdrawal after use?</p> <p>Maggie – This is a one time use/fix. Once this is administered, emergency services should be contacted immediately.</p> <p>Health West just received a grant to do medication assisted therapy. This will be a good resource to help assist with people going into withdrawal.</p> <p>Bill – Would like to have it available to the treatment facilities as well.</p> <p>JoAnn – We need to be looking to get it to everyone in the region, not just the Pocatello area. Who responds first to an overdose? Those are the people that should have it.</p> <p>Paul – Law enforcement personnel will be the first responders. They can administer it in the 3-5 minutes before ambulance arrives.</p> <p>We have 10 two dose vials. Maggie can follow up to see if there are any other available doses.</p> <p>Fran motioned that in the event that JoAnn contacts a county that would like the doses, she can distribute it to them. Lynda seconded the motion. Charlie amended motion to include that JoAnn document which counties received doses, and how many doses. Motion passed unanimously.</p>
