The event will take place on Mother's Day, **Sunday, May 14, 2017, at Centennial Park**. The Mom n' Me 5k Fun Run/Walk is an effort to create a healthy tradition for friends and family on Mother's Day. The event is held on the Portneuf Greenway, beginning and ending at Centennial Park and allows easy access for all generations. "The Mom 'n Me is not competitive & is untimed. We do this so that everyone and all abilities can participate, said Dana Solomon, Mom 'n Me Organizer.

After the event, refreshments are served, raffle prizes are awarded, and flowers will be provided to participants.
