## Southeastern Idaho Public Health’s Weekly COVID-19 Update

For the week of July 13-July 19, Southeastern Idaho Public Health had 82 new confirmed and probable cases of COVID-19. This brings the total of confirmed and probable cases to 17,407. Out of the 17,407 cases, 17,296 have recovered from COVID-19.

There are three confirmed deaths related to COVID-19 all from Bannock County: a female in her 70’s, a female in her 50’s and a male in his 40’s. This brings the total to 235 deaths due to COVID-19. Out of respect to these individuals’ families, no additional details will be released.

- Get vaccinated as soon as possible.
