## Southeastern Idaho Public Health’s Weekly COVID-19 Update

For the week of June 29 -July 5, Southeastern Idaho Public Health had 22 new confirmed and probable cases of COVID-19. This brings the total of confirmed and probable cases to 17,293. Out of the 17,293 cases, 17,253 have recovered from COVID-19.

There was also one confirmed death in a female in his 70’s from Bingham County. This brings the total to 232 deaths due to COVID-19. Out of respect to these individuals’ families, no additional details will be released.
