## 8 New Cases Identified in Southeastern Idaho

Southeastern Idaho Public Health has 8 new confirmed and probable cases of COVID-19 in southeast Idaho. This brings the total of confirmed and probable cases to 16,964. Out of the 16,964 cases, 16864 have recovered from COVID-19. See county case counts below:
