Southeastern Idaho Public Health’s Weekly COVID-19 Update

For the week of September 21 – September 27, Southeastern Idaho Public Health had 906 new confirmed and probable cases of COVID-19. This brings the total of confirmed and probable cases to 21,936. Out of the 21,936 cases, 20,645 have recovered from COVID-19.

There are eleven confirmed deaths related to COVID-19. There are five in Bannock County: a female in her 60’s, two males in their 80’s, a male in his 60’s and a female in her 70’s. There were three deaths in Bingham County: a male in his 50’s, a female in her 40’s and a female in her 60’s. There were two deaths in Butte County: a male in his 60’s and female in her 40’s. Additionally, there was one death in Caribou County, a male in his 80’s. This brings the total to 290 deaths due to COVID-19. Out of respect to these individuals’ families, no additional details will be released.
