## Southeastern Idaho Public Health’s Weekly COVID-19 Update

For the week of April 5 – April 11, 2022, Southeastern Idaho Public Health had 21 new confirmed and probable cases of COVID-19. This brings the total of confirmed and probable cases to 37,890. Out of the 37,890 cases, 37,365 have recovered from COVID-19. There was 1 confirmed death, which brings the total to 509 deaths, due to COVID-19. Out of respect to these individuals’ families, no additional details will be released. There are no deaths to report.
