Southeastern Idaho Public Health’s Weekly COVID-19 Update

For the week of April 12 – April 18, 2022, Southeastern Idaho Public Health had 62 new confirmed and probable cases of COVID-19. This brings the total of confirmed and probable cases to 37,952. Out of the 37,952 cases, 37,419 have recovered from COVID-19.

There were also two confirmed deaths, which brings the total to 511 deaths due to COVID-19. Out of respect to the individual’s family, no additional details will be released.
