## Southeastern Idaho Public Health’s Weekly COVID-19 Update

For the week of February 1, 2022 – February 7, 2022, Southeastern Idaho Public Health had 1,134 new confirmed and probable cases of COVID-19. This brings the total of confirmed and probable cases to 36,663. Out of the 36,663 cases, 34,689 have recovered from COVID-19. There were also 1 confirmed death, which brings the total to 470 deaths, due to COVID-19. Out of respect to these individuals’ families, no additional details will be released.
