Southeastern Idaho Public Health’s Weekly COVID-19 Update

For the week of February 8, 2022 – February 14, 2022, Southeastern Idaho Public Health had 641 new confirmed and probable cases of COVID-19. This brings the total of confirmed and probable cases to 37,301. Out of the 37,301 cases, 35,965 have recovered from COVID-19. There were also 6 confirmed deaths, which brings the total to 476 deaths, due to COVID-19. Out of respect to these individuals’ families, no additional details will be released.
