Southeastern Idaho Public Health’s Weekly COVID-19 Update

For the week of December 28, 2021 – January 3, 2022, Southeastern Idaho Public Health had 286 new confirmed and probable cases of COVID-19. This brings the total of confirmed and probable cases to 27,927. Out of the 27,927 cases, 27,193 have recovered from COVID-19. There were also 4 confirmed deaths, which brings the total to 451 deaths, due to COVID-19. Out of respect to these individuals’ families, no additional details will be released.
